The summer will be here before we know it, and we are excited for the adventures and surprises ahead. The new zip-line traversing across the fishing pond will be open this summer, and we have many events in the works for the new live music venue at lakefront. We work hard each year to provide new opportunities and experiences for our campers that they would not get

anywhere else, and we're certain that this summer is going to be unforgettable!

Thanks to the more than 50 participants in the third annual Jingle Jump, we raised more than \$44,000 for the ASCCA Campership Fund. The jump into 30-degree water was a little chilly but well worth it! The funds raised help more than 85% of our campers attend summer camp each year, so without events like the Jingle Jump, ASCCA summers would not be possible for many families. Registration for all campers - paying full price or needing financial assistance - opened up at the



start of the year, and we are already overflowing to waitlists for several sessions. It is exciting to see so many people from across the Southeast signing up for the experience of a lifetime.



Earlier this year, we were also joined by groups from the Lakeshore Foundation for two weekend sessions of hunting and a group of Pi Kappa Phi men who visited Camp to help complete projects across the campus as a part of The Ability Experience. Before summer arrives, we have several events lined up for spring. Fun Fish Weekend will kick off on March 23 and will be a weekend of nothing but fishing and fun with some of our ASCCA campers and volunteers. It's sure to be a great catch! Later in the spring, we will also welcome a variety of groups who will be using our facilities for camping programs, school events, and much more.
