Camp ASCCA TINGLE JUMP

Camp ASCCA's fifth annual Jingle Jump fundraiser was held on Saturday, Dec. 14, and it was a huge success thanks to campers, staff, donors, volunteers and friends. All fundraising began on Nov. 1 and lasted until the final jump into the ASCCA pool on Dec. 14.

This year, we had 59 jumpers participating in the fundraiser, and they all worked together to raise over \$45,000 to sponsor campers with disabilities to attend summer camp. The funds raised this year have the potential to support 60 full camperships. All participants who reached their goal of \$750 or more had to jump into the ice cold ASCCA pool during our annual Christmas Weekend.

On Saturday, we also had the largest team of jumpers we have ever had with more than 20 students from Benjamin Russell High School's Interact Club jumping in at once. Thank you to everyone who contributed this year!

The team that raised the most money this year was Nurse Peggy Long and Ann Herndon with \$9,670.



The counselor who raised the most money individually was Caroline Kelly with \$1,440. However, she had Nurse Jaco jump in her place.




The camper that raised the most money this year was Cale Galloway with \$3,230.


