Accessible Waterslide nears completion

Look for the completion by May 2010!

Has the seemingly unending rain stopped yet? It feels like just yesterday we were talking about a drought. Anyway, now that our land has dried out a bit, we're back on schedule to complete the new accessible waterslide at Camp ASCCA.

The 200 foot accessible waterslide is being constructed on a hill behind the chapel overlooking Lake Martin. The entrance to the slide is being constructed at ground level. By constructing it at ground level, transfers of our non-ambulatory campers will be easier and safer than on a traditional elevated waterslide. The accessible waterslide will end at a 50 foot level section where riders will come to a stop.

The development of the waterslide will increase the level of enjoyment for our campers by creating a new opportunity for excitement and a unique new camp experience! To find out more about this project, contact John Stephenson, Camp Administrator.
