Easter Seals camp ASCCA has been providing camping and outdoor recreation to children and adults with disabilities since 1976. Camp ASCCA is the only program of its kind in the state of Alabama. The combination of accessibility to activities, quality attendant care and affordability has also made Camp ASCCA a leader in the industry nationally.

Camp ASCCA prides itself in creating an environment which provides fun, interesting and challenging activities for our participants. We want there to exist a "wow" factor for those that see our

facility and its activities for the first time. Last year we developed and constructed an 18 hole accessible miniature golf course. The year prior we constructed a "water playground" similar to those found at water parks nationally. These activities joined the other 27 activities that include a zip-line, a climbing tower and tubing.

We understand that for the vast majority of our campers that Camp ASCCA is the only location where they have the opportunity to participate in these types of activities.

BECKY JOHNSON!

On November 14th Camp ASCCA presented the 2009 Camper of The Year Award to Miss Becky Johnson of Dothan. Becky has been attending Camp ASCCA for the last ten years and describes Camp as her "favorite place to be!" She has participated in several Camp ASCCA videos taken during the summer, and is always eager to tell people about ASCCA. Becky recently graduated from high school and is now a student at Troy University.

2010 FACILITY UPGRADES & ADDITIONS

Accessible Waterslide - \$19,000 budget

The 300 foot accessible waterslide will be constructed on an existing hill overlooking Lake Martin. It will wind down the hill and end at a level section where riders will come to a stop and exit.

Fitness & Exercise Room - \$8,000 budget

Using a Wii gaming system as the centerpiece, the purpose of the room is to allow individuals of all abilities the opportunity to participate in fun, safe activities which will promote the general fitness level. Additional exercise equipment included.

Accessible Fishing - \$13,500 budget

Creation of a 400 foot accessible nature path and construction of a 600 square foot rock levy on which a 500 square foot accessible fishing deck will be built.

ENERGY CONSERVATION AT CAMP ASCCA

Easter Seals Camp ASCCA is implementing a program that will decrease its annual energy consumption by 21%. In addition to the energy savings, the program will be highlighted during our environmental education camps which annually serve over 1,200 school aged children from across the state of Alabama. Using Ecofficient Energy Solutions of Birmingham as the contractor, Camp ASCCA is currently replacing and retrofitting over 1,800 bulbs and/or fixtures. The bulbs and fixtures are being replaced with great efficient devices that not only will reduce Camp ASCCA's energy consumption, but will also help reduce the emissions of our power provider. Specifically, we are replacing the ballast in the bulbs in 411 four foot fluorescent fixtures with new t-8 lighting, replacing 863 incandescent bulbs with CFL bulbs, and replacing 91 other incandescent bulbs and their fixtures with t-8 lighting.
