Medication Packaging & Acceptance Policy

- 1. **All Daily Scheduled Medications** will be given to the Designated Medication Passers at Check-in on Sunday. The medications must be appropriately packaged in weekly blister packs or sachets. The medications packaged for the camper's week at camp *must* have a prescription label that is current and accurate.
 - All prescriptions should include patient name, medication name, dose, and route. Any prescription medication that arrives without appropriate labeling will not be accepted for distribution.
 - b. For any OTC medications and supplements that are to be given daily, there must be an order from the camper's prescriber for each medication and supplement. This includes liquid medications.
 - c. Prescription liquid medications, eye drops, inhalers, and powders, and any medication or supplements that are not in pill form must be brought with the prescription label.

2. **PRN/As needed Medications** will be given to the Camp Nurses at Check-in. *These medications must be packed separately from Daily Scheduled Medications.*

- a. PRN Over the Counter medications that are brought to camp need to be in the original container and unopened.
- b. Prescription PRN medications must have a prescription label that is correct and up to date on the packaging. PRN medications brought in the correct prescription bottle with enough pills to cover the week are acceptable.

3. If medications are not and cannot be packaged and brought to camp as stated above, this will result in the camper not being accepted into camp for the week.

4. All Medications must be updated in the camper's application within Camp Brain prior to arrival to Camp ASCCA. It is the responsibility of the parent/caregiver to update any discontinued medications, new medications that will be given at camp, and dosage changes that have occurred since the camper was registered for camp.

 Camp ASCCA will open the camper applications for each summer session at least 2 weeks prior to check-in to allow parents adequate time to update all medications.

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
